**Educating students for their future, not our past.**

Our challenge as a College is to get our young people “World Ready”. This is essential given it is expected that up to 65% of today’s students will be employed in jobs that as yet have not been created. It is understood that young people that leave school now will change jobs 15 times and have 5 different careers. While knowledge will always be important, our young people need to become creative and flexible, and will need the ability to learn as they go – to be life long learners.

According to the World Economic Forum, the 10 most important skills students will need are:

- Complex Problem Solving
- Critical Thinking
- Creativity
- People Management
- Coordinating with others
- Emotional intelligence
- Judgement and decision making
- Service orientation
- Negotiation
- Cognitive flexibility

It makes for interesting reading. Numeracy and Literacy skills will always be indispensable but it seems obvious that our young people will also need to leave school with highly developed people skills. Many attributes on this list involve interpersonal skills, and the ability to lead and work with others.

It is important that we work with our families to ensure our students are developing these personal skills, that our young people are able to communicate effectively, are able to voice their opinions while also being able to listen to others. They also need to be able to critically analyse the information they are presented with and not believe everything they read. Also, teamwork continues to be an essential attribute.

We will continue to refine our approach at school to ensure our students develop academic and personal skills so they have a solid foundation for their future and to become World Ready.

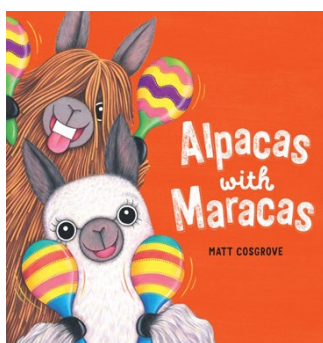

# SACE

The SACE Board will require Stage 1 moderation samples for selected subjects in June and preparations for submission of these samples are now underway. Selected Stage 1 subjects are moderated on a 3 year cycle in Semester 1. Moderation material for the Stage 2 Research Project will be submitted to the SACE board electronically this year; preparations are currently continuing to ensure that IT support in the College for this electronic submission is in place. Staff are attending SACE Board conferences this term for subjects that have undergone revision for teaching in 2020 and preparations are also underway to link assessment groups of subjects with few students with cohorts from other schools to ensure moderation integrity and to meet the SACE Board requirement for statistical moderation. Linking for Specialist Mathematics and Physics is presently being finalized and preparations for other subjects are underway.
