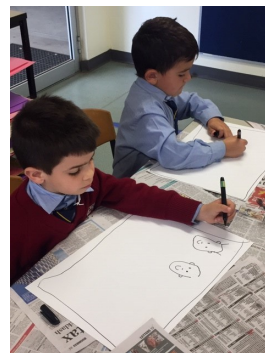
The students gained valuable insight into the art world, drawing and painting, and learnt how to correct mistakes, rather than starting over.

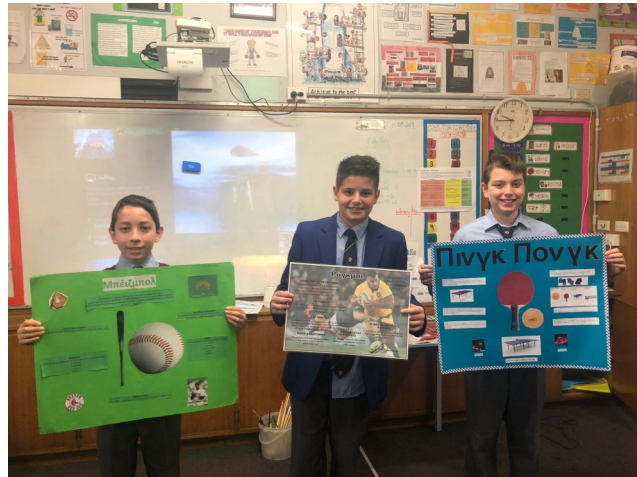
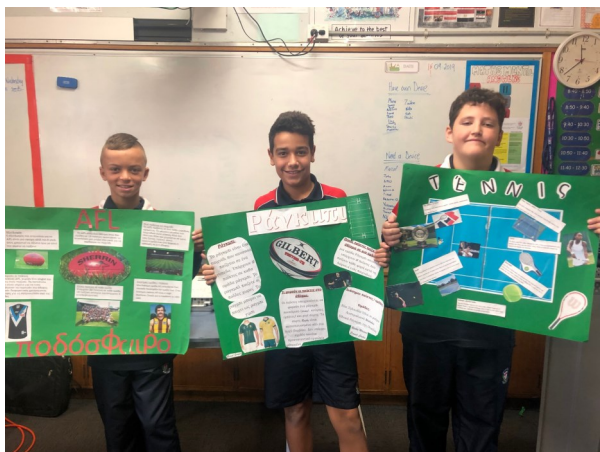




# Greek Corner

University of SA: Bachelor of Speech Pathology. Four year degree, commencing in July 2020

Uni SA has announce that a new Bachelor of Speech Pathology will be offered along with their other allied health degrees in areas such as physiotherapy, occupational therapy, psychology, social work, podiatry and medical radiation science in 2020. Applications will open for the new Bachelor of Speech Pathology in April 2020, via SATAC, to commence July 2020, as part of UniSA's mid-year intake.

University of Adelaide: Bachelor of Applied Data Analytics. Three year course commencing in February 2020

University of Adelaide: The Bachelor of Technology (Defence Industries) and Bachelor of Information Technology will be offered by the University for 2020. These courses have been developed in direct response to industry demand for skilled and trained professionals in these high-growth areas.

The SACE Board Stage 2 timetables for 2019 written examinations which make up 30% of the final grade in selected subjects have been distributed to students. The Schools Online database for the second semester is now fully updated and all SACE Board cutoff dates have been met as have any special administrative requirements for particular subjects and classes. Stage 1 enrolments have been finalized for Semester 2 and Stage 2 enrolments are now complete for the 2019 academic year. The SACE Coordinator recently attended a conference where details were elaborated as to how moderation material is to be submitted to the SACE board electronically in November this year; preparations are currently continuing to ensure IT support in the College for this electronic submission is in place.
