



English Language Support

English support for students with English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EAL/D) focuses on the development of students' ability to communicate effectively in English.

St George College provides devoted teacher support for students with English as an Additional Language (EAL) and focuses on the development of students' ability to communicate effectively in English. With a dedicated EAL classroom, students have a comfortable space to build on their abilities and have access to the room throughout the day to study and share their culture and stories with other students.

Small class sizes are a major advantage for EAL students and St George College's engaging classroom environment makes for excellent learning opportunities. With low teacher to student ratios, EAL students gain extra attention and support throughout their lessons.

EAL teachers are specifically trained and focus on improvement of students core English skills of speaking, reading, writing, and listening.

Happy Home Stay (HHA)




International students who do not live with a parent or blood relation in Adelaide, live in Homestay.

Homestay is a wonderful opportunity for cultural exchange between the student and an Australian family.

St George College has partnered with the Happy Homestay Adelaide (HHA) to give students the opportunity to be hosted by a specially trained HHA Homestay host, for a safe and happy introduction to living and studying in Australia.

Homestay hosts assist students to settle into their new life in Adelaide and provide useful tips and information needed for a rewarding and unforgettable experience. Most importantly students in Homestay are treated as a family member. This helps improve the student's English and makes them feel welcome.

Students are supplied with meals, their own bedroom with study facilities, access to bathroom and laundry facilities and transport to and from school. Personal belongings are also covered by insurance under the HHA-SA Insurance policy.



Early Learning Centre



Education is a journey. Children and their families, are welcome to begin this exciting journey in a nurturing and loving Early Learning Centre at St George College.

Carefully planned, quality play experiences provide opportunities for our children to practice and develop skills and make sense of their world. Diversity and uniqueness is celebrated, regardless of age, gender, race, cultural background or additional needs.

We are informed by the Early Years Learning
Framework, that is supportive of a range of
different theories and approaches to Early
Childhood and extends and enriches children's
learning from birth to five years.

The ELC's curriculum and pedagogy is based on the belief that:

Play-based experiences are meaningful. Through active exploration, a child gains confidence, learns strategies for thinking and reasoning, and helps children make sense of the natural, social, physical and material worlds.

Our Early Intervention Program, identifies students in the early years who need additional help with their learning. They are supported by special education staff and other professionals.

Routines are established to provide opportunities to learn about order, sequencing, and concepts of time. Established routines make for smoother transitions and help children to prepare mentally for the day ahead, while providing frameworks in which creative learning can occur. This provides opportunities for making decisions and acting responsibly. Having a daily schedule helps ease a child's transition to the structure of the school setting.

Programs we offer:

- Playgroup (1-2 Years Old)
- Pre-entry Program (3 Years Old)
- Preschool Program (4 Years Old)

Junior School

The Junior Campus is Reception to Year 4.

These early years are critical to foundational learning. Students are nurtured into building strong foundations in literacy and numeracy.

A combination of structured lessons and play activities, allow students to take measured risks in the development of language formalities and the proper application of reading and writing.

As students progress, their study widens to all eight learning areas via a multifaceted, diverse learning program through the Curriculum: with our Literacy and Numeracy, English as a Second Language Program and our Learning Support Program. The Diverse Learning Program is offered at St George College as a whole school approach.

While we assist our students in meeting their personal goals and challenges, we promote a culture of collaboration that caters to a wide range of student needs, abilities and interests.

With guidance from the Learning Support staff, teachers develop programs and implement strategies to assist students to develop a love of learning and to achieve their full potential. Our ongoing commitment to inclusive education principles has seen St George College sustain and build a number of learning initiatives which aim to allow our students to access the curriculum in a meaningful manner.

As a result, students are able to optimise their competence in oral, listening, reading and writing for a variety of audiences and a range of contexts. We take pride in our Health and Physical Education program. With the help of our Sports Centre, this varied and challenging program promotes the healthy lifestyle habits that students can take with them for life

Our Information Technology Centre ensures students acquire the skills and confidence to succeed in our ever expanding and evolving technological world.

Middle School

- Digital Technology
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics
- Humanities
- Health and Physical Education
- Food and Hospitality

Students have extensive access to Information

Technology, our Performing Arts and Sports Centre,

Science Laboratory, Music Centre, and Library, providing opportunities to maximise learning for success in these challenging years of schooling.

In addition to the standard curriculum student learning is support by English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D) program and the Learning Needs Support Team.

A balanced education

St George College recognises that co-curricular activities represent an essential part of our students' total educational experiences. The Co-Curricular Program at St George College is based on the interest of the students and provides them with the opportunity to develop the whole person in preparation for active citizenship in the world beyond school. These activities offer students opportunities to develop skills in teamwork, co-operation, self-discipline and commitment. St George College actively encourages students to explore and enjoy a sense of community and identity.

Senior School

Our flexible and student driven curriculum, supportive staff and extensive resources provides our Senior students with the springboard for success.

A partnership with families

At this sensitive age of emerging adulthood, a time when students wish to exercise greater independence and individuality, we know that a strong and supportive partnership between home and school is imperative.

That's why we endeavor to work with families in giving every student the guidance and reassurance they need in these critical years of adult development.

Although Year 12 is arguably the most important year in a student's academic career, we understand that Years 9 and 10 are vital in setting the tone for success.

Our Year 10 students are given the opportunity to undertake selected courses that are accredited towards the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

SACE

The curriculum which is set by the South Australian Certificate of Education Board (SACE Board) is divided into Stage 1 (Year 11) and Stage 2 (Year 12).

In supporting our students to meet the SACE Board completion requirements, we offer:

- Student centered subject choice in completing SACE with a focus on entrance to University, TAFE or employment
- Individualised career planning service
- Skilled and experienced senior secondary
 educators
- Holiday Workshops
- Flexible learning time for Year 12 students
- Opportunities to study VET units in areas of their choice – qualifying for dual accreditation towards
 SACE and further tertiary studies including on site delivery of Certificate II Hospitality and Certificate
 III Kitchen Operations

In keeping with the proud ethos and culture of our College, our Senior School students are encouraged to contribute to our community through the Student Representative Council, Peer Mentoring Program and participation in school events.





Trade Training Centre

St George College facilities include a state-of-the-art Hospitality Trade Training Center. It enables unique, creative, and high-quality pre-vocational training. The Certificate II Hospitality and Certificate III Kitchen Operations Courses are offered on-site, providing Year 10 and 11 students with the chance for dual accreditation, preparing them for employment in the vibrant and fast-paced hospitality sector. The Trade Training Center provides students with the hands-on training and certifications in baking, hospitality, and manufacturing, providing them with a springboard into the industry after graduation.

Vocational Education Training (VET) allows students to gain industry skills and information by studying in a nationally recognised industry-developed training package or an accredited course. VET complements the students curriculum frame work.

The weather in South Australia

These are the average daily temperatures for Adelaide:

- Average daily winter temperatures (June August), Adelaide Max 15.9°C, Min 8°C.
- Average daily spring temperatures (September November), Adelaide Max 21.7°C, Min 11.6°C.
- Average daily summer temperatures (December February), Adelaide Max 28.3°C, Min 16.5°C, but daily temperatures can get as high as 45°C.
- Average daily autumn temperatures (March May), Adelaide Max 22.4°C, Min 12.5°C

South Australia operates on Australian Central Standard Time (ACST) which is 30 minutes behind Australian Eastern Standard Time.
